- There are some Outdoor Recreation Leadership courses that are taught in the 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the semester only. They are usually paired with another course in the other half, but not always.
- Courses marked with an asterisk (\*) are offered only in one semester (Spring or Fall).
- The activity courses in the minor (RECR 1150, RECR 1151, RECR 1177, and RECR 1188) may require travel and overnight stays off-campus.
