Examples for Satisfactory Performance Standards:

1-The average of all students will be greater than 3 for a specific rubric--could then discuss the mean, median, and mode. Note: The mean uses all scores, while the median indicates the score for which 50% of data is above this value. The mode is the most frequent score. It probably is not appropriate unless the number of students is large and the number of subdivisions for the rubric is small.

2-Class median is above 70% pertaining to the specific problem or project. (i.e., Half the students make 70% or better on the problem or project.)

3-Median score on a test question(s) is above 22 points out of 30.

4-100% of the nursing students can give an injection (or any skill that is either mastered or not mastered by the student to become a major.)

5-70% of the students will receive a score of 75% or better on specific questions of the exam pertaining to the associated outcome.

6-80% of students make a C or better on the essay associated with the specific class outcome.
