 - Current enrollment in principal internship: 5 students enrolled in a portion. 1 credit
 = 80 hours.
 - Amanda currently participating in the internship. Initial difficulty enrolling in a variable credit option this semester. Otherwise, things are working well.

b. Overview of new Superintendent Internship (optional for out of state candidates) – PowerPoint Used during the meeting and sent in email prior to meeting.

- Will begin this summer. One expected to enroll in the summer. Out of state students sometimes need the internship for state requirements and that is why it is being offered.
- Designed with NELP District-Level Standards.
- Supervisor is either a superintendent or an administrative position with superintendent certificate.
- 240 hours, each credit worth 80 hours. Possible for this to be completed over multiple semesters.
- Instead of a portfolio as in principal internship for final assignment, it will be a reflection paper.
- Aligned to NELP standards, but will vary based on area requirements.
- Real world experience at district level based on NELP standards.

4. Current Enrollment and help for student retention

• 29 students enrolled in all Educational Leadership Programs. Down from Fall enrollment of 54. A large cohort just graduated.

5. Marketing and Recruitment - New approaches to attract prospective students

- Currently revising the program sheet and will be sent out to the state administrator association in West Virginia to be distributed.
- Open to coming to K-12 faculty events which would help promote and build the program.
- Paul Mihalko has said he would help to distribute materials to Pennsylvania.
- Kristen Smallwood would be willing to do a Q&A Session to help with any recruitment.
- Online tuition is the same no matter what state might be from.
- Why did the students select here? Local students and familiar with FSU. Previous graduates made recommendations.
- We will distribute marketing materials to advisory board members when prepared.
