- ✓ \*Courses with asterisks are recommended Core Curriculum courses needed to meet program requirements
- ✓ Field Experience 1 is currently an immersive virtual field experience using *The Teaching Channel*
- ✓ Maintain 3.00 GPA – overall, in the field, in EDUC classes
- ✓ Prepare and submit Admissions Portfolio in TaskStream
- ✓ Must meet requirements for either provisional or full admission to enroll in EDUC 2203
- ✓ To fulfill the Basic Skills requirements required by the WV Dept. of Education, students must earn a grade of “B” or better in ENGL 1101, 1102 and MATH 1430/1530
