BACHELOR OF SCIENCE CRIMINAL JUSTICE

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Criminal Justice examines the structure, functions, and decision-making processes of agencies that deal with crime and criminal offenders. As an independent academic discipline, criminal justice is comparatively new. Interest in criminal justice education was spurred by the "war on crime" during the 1960's and the resulting massive federal funding to upgrade criminal justice agencies, technology, programming and education of criminal justice personnel.

Faculty in this program provide expertise in law enforcement, investigations, corrections, criminal law, research and theory. The Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice allows the student flexibility to choose courses which best reflect their individual interests and career aspirations.

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Students with a B.S. degree in criminal justice qualify for employment in city, county, state and federal criminal justice agencies, and in the rapidly-growing private industrial security field. A number of graduates continue their education in graduate programs in criminal justice, criminology or law. The program also offers a Master of Science degree in Criminal Justice.

Additional Requirements for BS in Criminal Justice Major:

Criminal Justice Electives 15 CREDITS

A Criminal Justice elective is any Criminal Justice course not listed as required for the major. Must include a minimum of 12 credits of 3300 – 4400 level courses.

Social and Behavioral Sciences 21 CREDITS

Students must choose 21 hours form 2200-4400 courses in Geography, History, National Security and Intelligence, Political Sciences, Philosophy, Psychology, or Sociology. Courses must be chosen from at least three disciplines.
