- Literature



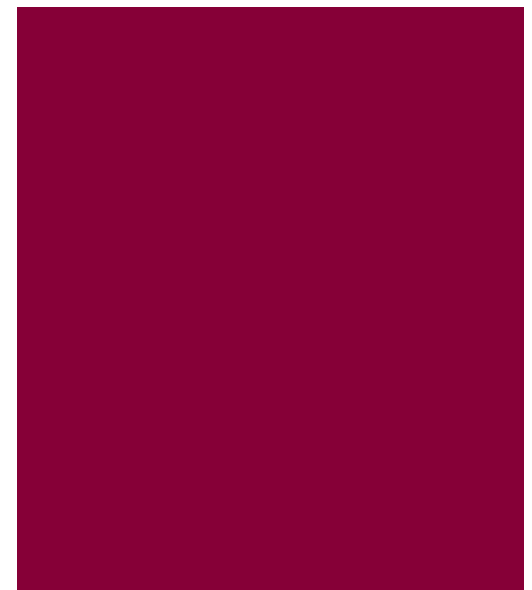
While earning their degree, English Education majors may train to be peer tutors for students at Fairmont State.
