## **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

Every person, every place, every thing on earth has a history, a story of its past, that can help us understand human existence and human behavior. The History Program's major and minor programs draw upon a broad curriculum that encompasses regional, national, and international history, as well as such special fields as the revolutions in history and diplomatic history. The History program offers two types of majors. The Bachelor of Arts degree has the traditional emphasis on language skills, especially through study of a foreign language. It is a good choice for students thinking about postgraduate study. The Bachelor of Science degree develops basic capabilities in statistics and computer science. It is a good choice for students interested in the modern social sciences approach to historical understanding.

## **EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES**


