MINOR IN MUSICAL ARTS

PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

The minor in Musical Arts provides students with an introduction to an academic understanding of music through theory, history, music business, and piano and also provides performance opportunities through university ensembles (marching band, wind ensemble, and choir). Students enrolled in the Musical Arts Minor will obtain a deeper understanding of music which will enhance their experiences both as a performer and an audience member, leading to a lifetime of musical enjoyment.

- Students of any major with a passion for music.
- Students who participated in band or choir in high school and would like to continue their engagement and education.
- Students who participate in the Community Arts program who want to further augment their musical studies.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES:

It is common knowledge that musicians and music majors are often accepted into law schools and medical programs, as music students who are successful have to be very disciplined, efficient in their work, and committed to excellence. It therefore stands to reason that an employer looking for such qualities would be drawn to a student who elected to minor in music.

- Provide musical performances of high quality and represent Fairmont State while offering musical entertainment to our audiences.
- Demonstrate personal integrity in working with other members of the ensemble, including resolution of interpersonal conflicts.


