Overview of the Program

Spanish is the ideal second major! At only 31 credits, the Spanish major pairs well with nearly any other major, especially Business, NSI, Criminal Justice, Sociology and Psychology, as well as a variety of minors. In pursuing a Bachelor of Arts in Spanish, students acquire linguistic and cultural skills that help them grow intellectually and interpersonally, expanding their worldview and intercultural competence. Spanish courses at Fairmont State develop students' linguistic and cultural proficiencies through speaking, listening, reading, and writing and engaging with authentic cultural materials and texts.

Why major in Spanish? To become a bilingual, multiculturally-minded, fully engaged global citizen. Spanish is one of the most spoken languages in the world and, here in the US, it is the second most spoken language. Speaking Spanish connects you to new communities, perspectives, travel and career opportunities. And, being bilingual keeps your brain and memory sharp as you age, offering lifelong cognitive benefits.

Students double majoring in Spanish can take courses tailored to their individual career goals and interests. Those who wish to pursue careers as interpreters or translators can establish the foundations needed to continue their studies.

Prospective students who have previously taken Spanish courses, heritage and native speakers can enter the program at a higher level and/or receive credit for coursework, after evaluation by the program coordinator.

Employment Opportunities

With over forty-one million Spanish speakers living in the US, Spanish majors are in high demand in the job market, sought out by employers in a variety of fields. In education, in particular, there is a critical need for Spanish teachers at all levels throughout the country. Cultural and linguistic proficiency in Spanish are becoming increasingly essential for professions such as social work, criminal justice, business, banking, nursing and healthcare.

Study Abroad Opportunities

A relationship with our affiliate KEI (www.keiabroad.org) offers students the opportunity to transfer financial aid and scholarship packages (PROMISE and others) to their study abroad experience. Students are also eligible for an affiliate discount on KEI semester programs, as well as additional Fairmont State scholarships.

Spanish majors are strongly encouraged to spend at least one semester or one summer abroad in a Spanish-speaking country, preferably but not necessarily in their junior year.

Students in approved internships (SPAN 3300) will receive 3-6 upper-division credit hours, depending upon the type and duration of the internship.

Note: All Spanish majors must take the ACTFL Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) in their senior year as a graduation requirement. Students are responsible for all test fees.
