

Dear Chuck:

The Library Committee of the Faculty Senate met this year and was briefed by Thelma Hutchins on the continuing difficulties with the budget for the Library. While the inflation rate for library materials continues to average nine to eleven percent annually, the library received no increase in budget for fiscal year 2009. The Committee voted unanimously to write the presidents of Fairmont State and Pierpont to ask for an additional \$150,000.00. Dr. McClain responded graciously with \$100,000.00 of added funding for the Library.

The situation remains tenuous because the costs of subscriptions for electronic databases, which are required for accreditation and which total more than \$400,000, continue to rise. We need to find a way to be sure that the Library receives adequate funding so that it can continue its excellent work of supporting teaching and learning at Fairmont State.



The faculty personnel met five times during this term beginning on January 20, 2009 and ending on February 24, 2009 to consider sabbatical proposals, tenure applications, and promotions to Associate Professor and Full Professor ranks. The Personnel Committee took the following actions:

- 1. We recommended sabbatical proposals from Dr. Donald Trisel and Dr. Phil Yeager. (These two proposals are currently under consideration for funding by the administration.)
- 2. We recommended tenure and promotion to associate professor for Dr. Mellissa Abbott, Dr. Mary Lynne Bennett, Dr. Valarie Huffman, Dr. Gwendolyn Jones, and Dr. Tadashi Kato.
- 3. We recommended promotion to associate professor for Mary Burnell and Robert Weaver.
- 4. We recommended promotion to professor for Dr. Valerie Morphew & Dr. Angela Schwer.

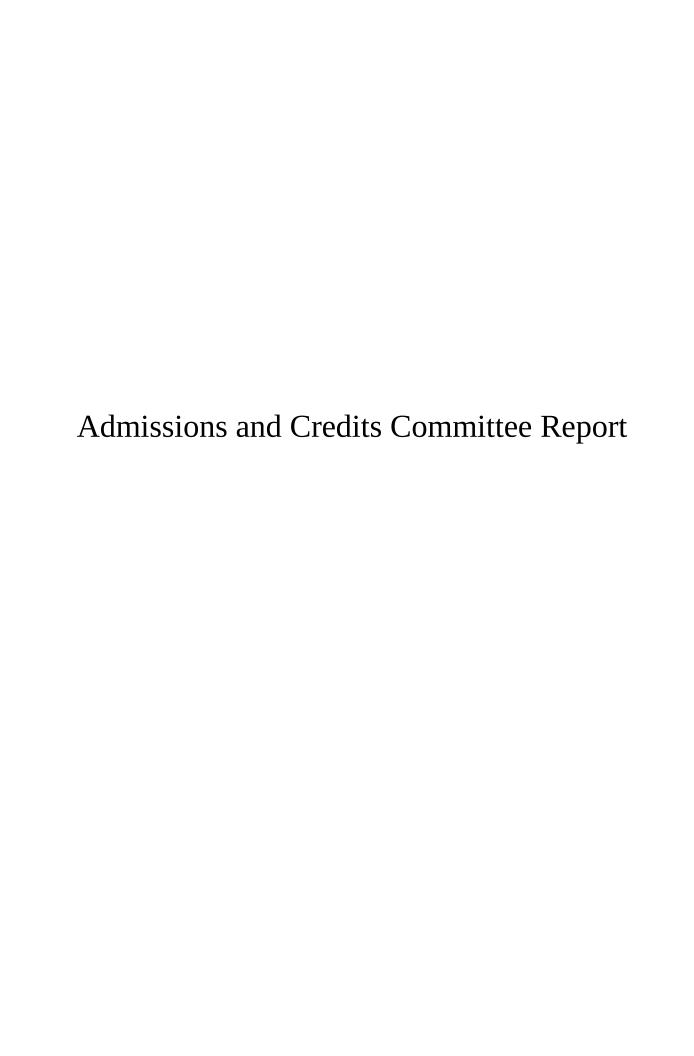
All recommendations for tenure and promotion have been approved by Dr. Maria Rose, Provost and Dr. Charles McClain, Interim President.

In addition to the above actions, the Chair would like to highlight some observations that may be of concern to the faculty senate in the future.

- 1. During our deliberations on promotion guidelines, it became apparent that faculty can interpret the new education requirements (for those faculty hired after July 1, 1999 found at the bottom of page 35—Faculty Handbook 2008-2009) differently. The senate may wish to make these guidelines more clear.
- 2. Under the education requirements for Associate Professor and Assistant Professor ranks, reference is made to **Appendix A** for additional certification requirement acceptable in lieu of a terminal degree. This five page addendum to the promotion guidelines may be edited for more clarity. In addition to the areas of Studio Art, Theatre Performance, Commerce Division, School of Business, Division of Technology, and the School of Nursing, other divisions/schools/departments at FSU may wish to submit addendum requirements that would make this part of the Faculty Handbook even more confusing.

This has been an enjoyable experience working with the personal committee and with Dr. Maria Rose during our deliberations.



Fairmont State Athletics April 14, 2009


Fairmont State University's athletic facilities have gone under some major changes in the last year with a new athletic field on Duvall-Rosier Field, a new walking track was put around the field, and a new fence that frames the outstanding complex. Over the last year the Feaster Center has gone through some major changes of its own in its heating and air conditioning units, weight room, new training room, new gym in the racquet ball area and a new office built on third floor. We have been very busy in changing the face of Duvall-Rosier Field and the Feaster Center to help with the use of it to our athletes, faculty and committee. We are in the process of changing the main look of the Feaster Center with a new entrance at street level and a new elevator. This also allows us to add 7 new offices for the coaches and facility to use. This new face lift for the Feaster Center will make the 30 year old building look like a new building.

The leadership of the athletic department includes many different people and different organizations here at Fairmont State University. Some of the areas that the department and organizations has to cover daily are; public relations, gender equity, marketing, promotions, recruiting, retention, public service, strategic planning, fiscal management, facilities use and up keep, fund raising, competition, compliance and performance evaluations. Some of the people and organizations are; director of athletics, associate athletic director, administrative secretaries, media and marketing director, SID, WSA, FAR, FSAA, and many athletes work within the communities. Fairmont State University has a team of people that work on each and every area of the athletic department daily.
