  - BOG representative Mild reported:
    - BOG Meeting
      - Approved the adding of 83 beds in the student dorms for Fall 2012
      - Refinancing of the bonds for the parking garage
    - Presidential Search Update
      - First search committee meeting on February 29
      - Paul Hill was on campus to speak with the BOG
      - 37 applications received from 20 states
      - Two more meetings planned
      - Plan to narrow to 3-4 top applicants to visit campus in April
      - Goal is to have new president selected and announced by May 1
  - Student Government No report
  - ACF representative Kelley reported:
    - ACF Great Teacher's Seminar Faculty participation is encouraged
    - Legislative session ends
    - 11<sup>th</sup> grade assessment standards to be collaboratively set by 'higher ed' and 'public ed'
    - HEPC Meeting Kelley attended with Dr. Rose Policy on books Publishers pushing online content
  - Barb Fallon Course Evaluations
    - Dr. Rose would like a recommendation from the Senate regarding a faculty vote in April on whether stay with the Banner evaluation tool or go back to IDEA
    - Josh Smallridge and Mike Ransom presented the results of an evaluation of construct validity and face validity of the Banner evaluation tool
    - Long moved to for the Faculty Welfare Committee to organize faculty forums to discuss the various evaluation tools, <u>bring faculty concerns back to Senate</u> <u>before initiating an online faculty vote</u> in April and Kelley seconded - Motion <u>not</u> carried
