Biographical / Historical Note

Patty Looman (February 7, 1925 to June 5, 2012), based in Fairmont and Mannington, West Virginia in her childhood and retirement years, is best known for playing hammered dulcimer in a distinctive regional style. Other regional performers who preceded Looman include Worley Gardner and Russell Fluharty. During retirement, Looman performed extensively in the region and taught private and group lessons. Looman refused payment from her private students, instead preferring that they pass on the knowledge and keep the tradition going. To celebrate Looman and provide more learning opportunities for the community, a festival called Pattyfest was created in 2002 and is going strong today (2025).

- Approximately 12 boxes of sheet music and music-related books compiled by Looman
- Approximately 1000 cassettes (commercial recordings; lessons, performances, and events taped by Looman)
- Approximately 5 A4 size document boxes with Looman's personal papers, most of which are organized into 4 categories: Personal (letters, photos); Performer (flyers, engagements); Pattyfest (related to the Pattyfest festival in Fairmont, WV); Instructor (contracts, correspondence)
- Looman's lap dulcimer, Vandalia Award, and assorted recordings (donated by Jeanie Howard, Looman's niece, in 2024)
