Appalachian Regional Commission



The Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) is an economic development partnership entity of the federal government and 13 state governments focusing on 423 counties across the Appalachian Region. ARC's mission is to innovate, partner, and invest to build community capacity and strengthen economic growth in Appalachia. Fairmont State is a proud recipient of two ARC POWER grants: a Planning Grant for \$34,604 in 2023 and an Implementation Grant of \$1.9M in 2024 that is ongoing until 2028.

Partnerships for Opportunity and Workforce Economic Revitalization Initiative (POWER)

This program targets federal resources to expand economic opportunities for communities and regions affected by job losses in coal mining, coal power plant operations, and coal-related supply chain or logistics industries. ARC seeks projects that will create high-quality, in-demand jobs, attract new sources of private investment, and provide comprehensive workforce services and skills training.
