

WV Research: Science, Technology & Research (STaR) Division



Opportunity Grant Program

This program seeks to support STEM education, demonstrate the value of STEM in West Virginia, and/or support those in STEM careers. Projects typically funded include, but are not limited to, camps or workshops for West Virginia residents, out of state travel to scientific conferences or for research purposes, and sponsorship of statewide scientific or technical events.

Instrumentation Grant Program

This program is designed to encourage undergraduate students in West Virginia to continue careers in STEM by increasing their exposure to scientific instrumentation. This program provides for the purchase of modern instruments for advanced undergraduate laboratories and encourages the submission of related proposals to the National Science Foundation and other federal agencies.

Innovation Grant Program

Curriculum enhancements and innovations in classroom instruction, delivery, and pedagogy are central interests of this program.

This grant program seeks proposals that show strong collaboration and the potential to create last change across West Virginia's higher education institutions with regard to affordability and student success. Projects may involve students with faculty working together to create, adapt, or adopt OER materials while using principles of open pedagogy to make learning more participatory and meaningful in Dual Enrollment, General Education, and other course areas.

This program supports projects that bring the ideas and insights of the humanities to life through in-person exhibitions and historic site interpretations. Project must focus on one of the following areas: American Military History and Valor, The American Dream and Economic Freedom, American Exceptionalism in World Affairs, or the

250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence. The program supports projects in two categories--exhibitions and interpretive programs at historic sites--and offers two funding levels: planning and implementation.

Department of State: Masterclass on Al for Economic Growth and Innovation

This program supports research and education projects that develop new knowledge in all aspects of computing, communications, and information science and engineering through various Future Computing Research programs including, but not limited to, Algorithmic Foundations, Communications and Information Foundations, Computing Education Research, Cyber-Physical System Foundations, Human-Centered Computing, Information Integration and Informatics, and Networking Technology and Systems.

National Science Foundation: NSF Translation to Practice

Posted: August 14, 2025

This program aims to advance accelerating technology translation and development, fostering regional innovation and economic growth, and preparing the American workforce for future high-wage jobs in STEM fields. This program seeks projects designed with the following goals in mind:

- To identify and support use-inspired research and translational activities enabling a continuum from foundational research to practice;
- To develop partnerships and collaborations between institutions of higher education and other entities such as industry partners and philanthropies;
- To promote and advance the education and training of students and postdoctoral researchers, encouraging the participation of all Americans in STEM including innovation and entrepreneurships; and
- To identify future customer needs and opportunities and bring these to the forefront in the conduct of use-inspired research and translational activities.

Simons Foundation: Simons Fellows in Mathematics

Posted: August 14, 2025

This program aims to make sabbatical research leaves more productive by extending them from a single term to a full academic year. A Simons Fellowship in Mathematics provides salary replacement and up to an additional \$10,000 for expenses related to the leave. Awards will be based on the applicant's scientific accomplishments in the five-year period preceding the application and on the potential scientific impact of the work to be done during the leave period.
