National Endowment for the Arts: NEA Grants for Arts Projects 1, FY 2027

Posted: January 15, 2026

This program provides project-based funding for organizations in the areas of Arts Education, Challenge America, Dance, Design & Our Town, Folk & Traditional Arts, Literary Arts, Local Arts Agencies, Museums, Music, Opera, Presenting & Multidisciplinary Works, Theater & Music Theater, and Visual and Media Arts. Funded activities may include a wide range of arts projects.

Bolger Foundation: Foundation Grants

Posted: January 15, 2026

This program provides capital funding to U.S. nonprofit organizations working to strengthen their infrastructure and better serve their communities. Grants specifically support projects that improve or expand tangible property owned by the applicant through efforts such as constructing or enlarging facilities, upgrading buildings or grounds, and purchasing long-lasting equipment such as technology or specialized tools.

Proposals Due: June 1, 2026

Funding Range: \$10,000 to \$250,000

Department of Education: Braille Training Program

Posted: January 15, 2026

The Braille Training Program offers financial assistance to projects that will (1) provide training in the use of braille for personnel providing vocational rehabilitation services or educational services to youth and adults who are blind; (2) develop braille training materials; (3) develop methods used to teach braille; and (4) develop activities used to promote the knowledge and use of braille and nonvisual access technology for youth and adults who are blind.

National Endowment for the Humanities: Endowment for Advancing the Humanities

Posted: January 15, 2026

The purpose of this program is to fund 20-year term endowments that advance the humanities on college and university campuses and at independent educational institutions, specifically by building the

organization's capacity in research and teaching of Western civilization, American history and government, and civics.

International Opportunity

Department of State: Salute to America 250 - Outreach Across Japan

Posted: January 15, 2026

This program invites proposal submissions for one to five cooperative agreements to design, administer, and implement high-level activities and innovative programming in all of Japan's 47 prefectures to showcase the historical legacy of American excellence, highlight American innovation, and celebrate the bilateral milestones and ties between U.S. and Japanese citizens that allow the U.S. and Japan to partner as global leaders.

STEM

National Aeronautics and Space Administration: Established Program to Stimulate Competitive Research (EPSCoR) Program Research Seed Grant, 2026-2027

Posted: January 15, 2026

This program will award seed grants to initiated research projects aligned with NASA's mission in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM). This program is designed to assist faculty at all West Virginia colleges and universities in their efforts to initiate research activities, conduct pilot experiments, or demonstrate new concepts that might lead to significant scientific projects in the future.

National Aeronautics and Space Administration: West Virginia Space Grant Consortium Research Initiation Grant, 2026-2027

This program seeks to fund research projects that are related to NASA's mission and West Virginia priorities in Science and Technology. This is a research initiation program with an objective to stimulate increased externally funded NASA sponsored research at academic affiliates of the NASA West Virginia Space Grant Consortium.

Workforce Development

Department of Labor: YouthBuild 2025

This program will award grants to eligible entities to provide pre-apprenticeship occupational skills training, education, and job placement services to opportunity youth. YouthBuild prepares participants for quality jobs in various industry sectors, and includes wrap-around supportive services such as assistance in transportation, childcare, and housing. YouthBuild programs must offer participants construction training and hands-on experience building affordable housing for their community.
