### Science and Technology - Research Infrastructure for Science and Engineering (CREST-RISE)

This CREST-RISE program supports the expansion of institutional research capacity by increasing the strength of institutional graduate programs and the successful production of research doctoral students, especially those from groups underrepresented in STEM. Proposals in all NSF supported areas as well as areas of national interest, such as artificial intelligence, data science and analytics, and cybersecurity, are encouraged. The goals of CREST-RISE are to increase: 1) the number of STEM research doctoral programs at Minority-Serving Institutions (MSIs), 2) the number of STEM research capacity to increase doctoral students' graduation rates.
