UPPER-DIVISION COURSES – 30 Hours (minimum)

Courses numbered **3000–4999** in any academic area can be used to fulfill this requirement. However, students must meet all prerequisites or obtain instructor approval before entry into upper-level courses is permitted.

REMAINING COURSES OR CREDITS – 54 Hours (minimum)

Students may earn the remaining credits by completing additional courses, presenting CLEP or military credits, taking departmental exams, or developing portfolio work based on experiential learning. Portfolio work must be tied to a specific course that is currently taught at Fairmont State University or at other institutions in the WV Public Higher Education System. Standard awards for credit are possible upon review of certifications and licenses that the state RBA program has established as credit bearing. All requests for credit based on learning other than college course work must be applicable to meeting degree requirements and approved by the RBA Degree Program Coordinator.

RESIDENCY – 24 Hours

Students must complete a residency requirement of 24 hours of course work within the WV Public Higher Education System; these hours may be completed at one or more institutions. However, at least 12 hours of that course work are required to be completed at Fairmont State.

TOTAL HOURS – 120 (minimum)

RBA students must complete a minimum of 120 hours of college credit with overall and institutional GPAs of at least 2.00 to be eligible for graduation.
