Hi John,

There is much talk around campus right now about the need to revise the Faculty Handbook. In our October meeting, the Faculty Welfare Committee discussed the need for a clear, specific process by which additions and revisions to the Faculty Handbook can be submitted and approved. To our knowledge, no such process exists. We drafted the following statement for the consideration of the Faculty Senate. Could you please add this to the agenda for the next Faculty Senate meeting.

Faculty Handbook revision policy statement

With all the talk of the need for a revision of the Faculty Handbook, the Faculty Welfare Committee would like to point out that—to our knowledge—there is no official policy in place for how additions and revisions to the Faculty Handbook are submitted and/or approved. We feel it is essential that a clear, specific process be in place before a revision of the handbook is undertaken. We also feel it is essential that the faculty have an oversight role in approving any additions or revisions to the handbook.

The Faculty Welfare Committee is willing to draft a prospective university policy for submitting and approving additions/revisions to the Fairmont State University Faculty Handbook, to be submitted to the Faculty Senate for their consideration. The work will be done in consultation with relevant administrative personnel.
