UPPER DIVISION COURSES – 39 Hours (minimum)

These courses may be selected from courses numbered **3000 – 4000** in any academic area. However, the student must meet **all prerequisites** or consent of instructor that may be required.

REMAINING COURSES OR CREDITS – 45 Hours

Students may earn the remaining credits by completing additional courses, presenting CLEP or military credits, taking departmental exams, or developing portfolio work based on experiential learning. Portfolio work **must be tied** to a specific course, currently taught at FSC or participating WV public institutions. Standard awards for credit are possible upon review of certifications and licenses that the state RBA program has established as credit bearing.

RESIDENCY – 24 Hours

Students must complete a residency requirement of 24 hours of course work taken at one or more institutions in the WV Public Higher Education System.

TOTAL HOURS – 120 (minimum)

RBA students must complete a minimum of 120 hours of college credit with a 2.00 GPA to be eligible for graduation.

All requests for credit based on learning other than college course work must be reviewed and evaluated by the RBA Coordinator prior to enrolling in the RBA program. Students must have been out of high school 4 or more years prior to enrolling in the RBA Program. A special application for admittance is required. For more information call 367-4193.
